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Adriana's Journey, by Patty Lyons, Westerville, Ohio

"In my darkest moments, my greatest sorrow and fear for Adriana is that she will be forever trapped by her own body. It was a sunny afternoon on May 12 [2005] when this fear was put to rest. This was the day that Adriana put all of the pieces together as she scooted, crawled and rolled across the room to retrieve one of her favorite books... It wasn't until I reviewed her annual goals for her Early Intervention service plan that I realized Adriana had achieved so much in such a short time. Not only is Adriana mobile, crawling and rolling independently with specific intent; she is working one-on-one with her therapists, she is clearly responding to "yes" and "no" questions, she knows her right and her left, and she is responding to verbal cues. As parents, we picture a life and a future for our children before they are even born. This picture is revisited often in our minds... While Adriana and I go through her daily exercise routine...massaging, stretching, strength training, sitting, standing, reaching, crawling...I can't help but remember that this is the picture that doctors labeled, "worse-case scenario." It is true that the life I had pictured for Adriana was forever gone when her life began fifteen weeks early. Since then, we have been painting a new picture, wrestling to accept her disabilities and delays. The two-weeks we spent at Euro-Pēds has given us a beautiful backdrop to a new dream...to new possibilities for Adriana. Every life is a journey. No matter how difficult it may be, Adriana's journey through life is a trip worth taking and I am privileged to be along for the ride".
